AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Compensation of the Members of the General Court, for the Compensation of the Officers thereof, and for Expenses in connection therewith.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified for the fiscal year end-
5 ing on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen
6 hundred and nine, to wit:—

7 For the compensation of senators, thirty thou-
8 sand seven hundred and fifty dollars. (Rev. Laws,
9 ch. 3, sect. 8.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$30,750.)

10 For compensation for travel of senators, a sum
11 not exceeding thirty-two hundred dollars. (Rev.
12 Laws, ch. 3, sect. 8.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$3,200.)

13 For the compensation of representatives, one
14 hundred and eighty-thousand seven hundred and
15 fifty dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 3, sect. 8.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$180,750.)

16 For compensation for travel of representatives,
17 a sum not exceeding nineteen thousand dollars.
18 (Rev. Laws, ch. 3, sect. 8.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$19,000.)

19 For the salaries of the assistant clerks of the
20 senate and house of representatives, four thou-
21 sand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 3, sect. 10; Acts
22 1907, ch. 304.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$4,000.)

23 For the salary of Henry D. Coolidge, clerk of
24 the senate, thirty-five hundred dollars. (Acts
25 1907, ch. 304.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$3,500.)

26 For such additional clerical assistance to the
27 clerk of the senate as may be necessary for the
28 proper despatch of public business, a sum not ex-
29 ceeding fifteen hundred dollars. (Acts 1904, ch.
30 87.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,500.)

31 For the salary of James W. Kimball, clerk of the
32 house of representatives, thirty-five hundred dol-
33 lars. (Acts 1907, ch. 304.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$3,500.)

34 For such additional clerical assistance to the
35 clerk of the house of representatives as may be
36 necessary for the proper despatch of public busi-
37 ness, a sum not exceeding twenty-five hundred dol-
38 lars. (Acts 1904, ch. 87; 1906, ch. 126.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$2,500.)

39 For the compensation of the chaplains of the

40 senate and house of representatives, six hundred
41 dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 3, sect. 14.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$600.)

42 For the salary of the sergeant-at-arms, thirty-
43 five hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10, sect. 10;
44 Acts 1903, ch. 455.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$3,500.)

45 For the salary of the first clerk in the office of
46 the sergeant-at-arms, twenty-two hundred dollars.
47 (Rev. Laws, ch. 10, sect. 10; Acts 1903, ch. 455.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$2,200.)

48 For the salary of the cashier of the sergeant-at-
49 arms, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.
50 (Rev. Laws, ch. 10; Acts 1903, ch. 323.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,000.)

51 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
52 sergeant-at-arms, and expense of mailing legisla-
53 tive bulletins, a sum not exceeding four hundred
54 and fifty dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$450.)

55 For the salaries of the doorkeepers of the senate
56 and house of representatives, and postmaster,
57 forty-two hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$4,200.)

58 For the compensation of assistant doorkeepers,
59 messengers and pages to the senate and house of
60 representatives, a sum not exceeding twenty-nine
61 thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10; Acts 1903,
62 ch. 323.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$29,000.)

63 For printing and binding ordered by the senate
64 and house of representatives, or by concurrent
65 order of the two branches, a sum not exceeding

66 thirty-eight thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6,
67 sect. 49.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$38,000.)

68 For printing and binding the manual for the
69 general court, under the direction of the clerks of
70 the senate and house of representatives, a sum not
71 exceeding five thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch.
72 9, sect. 10.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$5,000.)

73 For stationery for the senate, purchased by the
74 clerk, a sum not exceeding eight hundred dollars.
75 (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 49.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$800.)

76 For stationery for the house of representatives,
77 purchased by the clerk, a sum not exceeding one
78 thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 49.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,000.)

79 For books, stationery, postage, printing and ad-
80 vertising, ordered by the sergeant-at-arms, a sum
81 not exceeding twelve hundred dollars. (Rev.
82 Laws, ch. 6, sect. 49.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,200.)

83 For contingent expenses of the senate and house
84 of representatives, and necessary expenses in and
85 about the state house, a sum not exceeding five
86 thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 10, sect. 17.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$5,000.)

87 For authorized expenses of committees of the
88 present general court, to include clerical assistance
89 to committees authorized to employ the same, a
90 sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars. (Rev.
91 Laws, ch. 6.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$15,000.)

92 For expenses of advertising hearings of the
93 committees of the present general court, to include
94 expenses of preparing and mailing the advertise-
95 ments to the various newspapers, a sum not ex-
96 ceeding ten thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$10,000.)

97 For expenses of summoning witnesses, and for
98 fees of such witnesses, a sum not exceeding two
99 hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 51.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$200.)

100 For expenses in connection with the publication
101 of the bulletin of committee hearings, a sum not
102 exceeding forty-five hundred dollars.

(Appropriation 1908, \$4,500.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
