Bill accompanying the petition of William L. Parker and others for legislation to change and establish the boundary line between the towns of Scituate and Cohasset. Towns. January 8.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nine.

AN ACT

To change and establish the Boundary Line between the Towns of Scituate and Cohasset.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The line herein described shall be,
2 as far as it extends, a boundary line between the
3 town of Scituate in the county of Plymouth and the
4 town of Cohasset in the county of Norfolk, viz.:—
5 Commencing at the stone bound on the mill prop-
6 erty at the mouth of Bound brook marking the
7 present boundary between said towns; thence run-
8 ning by a straight line north, thirty-seven degrees
9 east, through a stone bound on Border street to a
10 stone bound at the southerly end of Briggs harbor;

11 thence northerly by the centre line of Briggs har-
 12 bor to Cohasset harbor.

1 SECTION 2. The boundary lines as heretofore
 2 established and existing between the counties of
 3 Plymouth and Norfolk and between the said towns,
 4 except so far as the same are altered by this act,
 5 are hereby confirmed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
 2 passage.
