AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Department of the Auditor of the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the
4 purposes specified, for the fiscal year ending on the
5 thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and
6 nine, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the auditor, five thousand dol-
8 lars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 14; Acts 1907, ch. 276.)
(Appropriation 1908, \$5,000.)

9 For the salary of the deputy auditor, thirty-five
10 hundred dollars. (Acts 1908, ch. 597.)
(Appropriation 1908, \$1,750, part of a year.)

11 For the salary of the supervisor of accounts in
12 the auditor's department, twenty-five hundred dol-
13 lars. (Acts 1908, ch. 597.)
(Appropriation 1908, \$1,250, part of a year.)

14 For the salary of the first clerk in the auditor's

15 department, twenty-five hundred dollars. (Rev.
16 Laws, ch. 6, sect. 14; Acts 1907, ch. 139.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$2,500.)

17 For the salary of the second clerk in the auditor's
18 department, twenty-two hundred dollars. (Rev.
19 Laws, ch. 6, sect. 14; 1907, ch. 139.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$2,200.)

20 For additional clerks, examiners, stenographers
21 and such additional clerical assistance as the auditor
22 may find necessary for the proper despatch of pub-
23 lic business, a sum not exceeding fourteen thousand
24 dollars. (Acts 1907, ch. 139.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$14,000.)

25 For the salary of the messenger in the auditor's
26 department, nine hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch.
27 6, sect. 14; Acts 1907, ch. 139.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$900.)

28 For the compensation of a state printing expert,
29 a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars. (Rev.
30 Laws, ch. 6, sect. 18.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,500.)

31 For incidental and contingent expenses in the de-
32 partment of the auditor, a sum not exceeding twen-
33 ty-five hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 6, sect. 25.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,500.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
