AN ACT

Relative to the Law of the Road.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter fifty-four of the Revised
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
3 three and inserting in place thereof the follow-
4 ing:—
- 5 *Section 3.* No person shall travel on a bridge or
6 way with a sleigh or sled drawn by a horse or
7 horses, unless there are three bells attached to
8 some part of the harness; and every vehicle, ex-
9 cept vehicles propelled by hand, stationary or mov-
10 ing, shall be provided with a lamp which shall,
11 during the period from one hour after sunset to

12 one hour before sunrise, be lighted: *provided, how-*
 13 *ever,* that nothing herein contained shall be con-
 14 strued as to affect any law, rule or regulation
 15 requiring lighted lamps upon motor vehicles.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
 2 passage.

Relative to the Law of the Road.

SECTION 1. Chapter 233B of the Statutes of the Commonwealth is hereby amended by striking out section 2 thereof and inserting in place thereof the following:-
