## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nine.

### AN ACT

Relative to the State Farm and the Prison Camp and Hospital.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section twenty-two of chapter two hundred and ten  
2 of the Revised Laws is hereby amended by inserting  
3 after the word "women", in the second line, the follow-  
4 ing words:—the state farm, the prison camp and  
5 hospital,—so that said section shall read as follows:—  
6 *Section 22.* Whoever wilfully disturbs the state prison,  
7 the Massachusetts reformatory, the reformatory prison  
8 for women, the state farm, the prison camp and hospital,  
9 or any jail or house of correction, or in any manner seeks  
10 to attract the attention of, or without the permission  
11 of the officer in charge has communication with, an in-  
12 mate thereof shall be punished by imprisonment for not  
13 more than three months or by a fine of not more than  
14 fifty dollars.
