

Bill accompanying the petition of John E. Rousmaniere and William F. Garcelon for legislation relative to the services of clerks in the office of the district attorney for the county of Suffolk. Public Service. March 19.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nine.

AN ACT

Relative to the Authority of Clerks in the Office of District Attorney of the County of Suffolk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The district attorney for the Suffolk dis-
2 trict may, if in his opinion the interests of the common-
3 wealth so require, with the approval of the chief justice
4 of the superior court, authorize any clerk or stenographer,
5 appointed under authority of chapter four hundred and
6 sixty of the acts of nineteen hundred and six, provided
7 such clerk or stenographer be an attorney-at-law, to exer-
8 cise all the powers of an assistant district attorney, but in
9 no instance shall any such authority, without renewal,
10 continue more than one year. Such an authorization
11 shall not affect the compensation of any clerk or stenog-
12 rapher so authorized.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
