AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TRAINING OF HUNTING DOGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 112 of chapter 131 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the last sentence and
3 inserting in place thereof the following: — Nothing in
4 this chapter shall be construed to require a person
5 attending or participating in such a field trial or such
6 training to secure a sporting or hunting license, pro-
7 vided that no firearm other than a pistol or revolver
8 and blank cartridges are used or possessed by such
9 person or persons, and that no birds or mammals are
10 taken or killed.

The Constitutionality of the Government

AN ACT TO DEFINE THE SCOPE OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATUTE

SECTION 1. The Constitution of the United States shall be construed in accordance with the following principles:

1. The Constitution is the supreme law of the land.

2. The powers of the Government are limited by the Constitution.

3. The rights of the people are protected by the Constitution.

4. The Government is established for the benefit of the people.

5. The Government is subject to the law.

6. The Government is responsible to the people.

7. The Government is accountable to the people.

8. The Government is answerable to the people.
