The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

RESOLVE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF EXCESS VOLUMES OF THE MASSACHUSETTS REPORTS STORED IN THE OFFICE OF THE STATE SECRETARY.

1 *Resolved*, That the commission established under gen-
2 eral laws, chapter nine, section twenty, be, and is au-
3 thorized to sell at prices below cost, seventy thousand
4 volumes of the Massachusetts reports stored in the
5 office of the state secretary. Said commission is au-
6 thorized to fix prices in its discretion and to sell said
7 volumes through the office of the state secretary by
8 direct sale or contract. All revenues shall be paid
9 into the office of the state secretary and shall be ac-
10 counted for by the state secretary as is provided by
11 law for all receipts of his office. It is recommended
12 that the commission established under the provisions
13 of section twenty of chapter nine of the general laws
14 be authorized to sell seventy thousand volumes of the
15 Massachusetts reports through the office of the state
16 secretary by direct sale or sale by the contracting
17 sales agent at prices fixed in their discretion below
18 the cost price of such volumes, all receipts to be ac-
19 counted for by the secretary.

THE COMPENSATION OF JUDGES

IN SENATE, JANUARY 10, 1901.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT, IN ANSWER TO A RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE SENATE, JANUARY 10, 1901.

1. Resolved, That the compensation of the judges of the
2. courts of this State shall be fixed by the Legislature, and
3. shall be paid in full at the expiration of each term of
4. office of the judges, and shall be paid in full at the
5. expiration of the term of office of the judges, and shall be
6. paid to the judges in full at the expiration of their term
7. of office, through the office of the state treasury, by
8. direct sale or contract. All expenses shall be paid
9. into the office of the state treasury, and shall be ac-
10. counted for by the state treasury, as is provided by
11. law for all receipts of his office. It is recommended
12. that the commission established under the provisions
13. of section twenty of chapter nine of the general laws
14. be authorized to sell seventy thousand volumes of the
15. Reports of the judges through the office of the state
16. treasury, by direct sale or sale by the contractor,
17. sales agent at prices fixed in their description below.
18. The cost price of each volume, all receipts to be ac-
19. counted for by the treasury.
