The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty.

AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CHELSEA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 65 of part II of chapter 680 of the acts of
2 1911, as amended, is hereby further amended by
3 striking out the first sentence and inserting in place
4 thereof the following sentence:— The salary of the
5 mayor shall be six thousand dollars per annum, and
6 the salary of each alderman one thousand dollars per
7 annum, except that in case of a vacancy in the office
8 of mayor the president of the board of aldermen shall
9 be entitled to the salary of the mayor while performing
10 the duties of mayor.

The Act passed by the Senate and House of Representatives on the 15th day of March 1890, and approved by the Governor on the 17th day of the same month.

AN ACT INCLUDING THE SALARIES OF THE JUDGES AND CLERKS OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the people of the Commonwealth, as follows:

- 1 Section 65 of part II of chapter 830 of the acts of 1890, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:—The salary of the Mayor shall be six thousand dollars per annum, and the salary of each alderman one thousand dollars per annum, except that in case of a vacancy in the office of Mayor the president of the board of aldermen shall be entitled to the salary of the Mayor while performing the duties of Mayor.
