AN ACT TO ADJUST INEQUITIES IN THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 In the computation of the amount of pension re-
2 tirement allowance to be paid to members of any
3 contributory system as provided in sections one to
4 twenty-eight, inclusive, of chapter thirty-two of the
5 General Laws, as amended, or under corresponding
6 provisions of earlier laws, and, if the context so re-
7 quires, to members of any contributory system es-
8 tablished under the provisions of any special law, re-
9 tired prior to January first, nineteen hundred and
10 forty-eight, the provisions of section seven, para-
11 graph (2) (a), subdivision (ii) as amended by chapter
12 four hundred and forty-six of the acts of nineteen hun-
13 dred and forty-eight shall apply.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

As amended by the Joint Committee on the Constitution

ARTICLE I. OF THE CONSTITUTION.
SECTION I.

The Senate and House of Representatives shall be chosen by the people of the Commonwealth, and by the majority of the votes cast thereon.

1. In the computation of the amount of persons to be chosen, the number of persons to be chosen shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each county or city, and by the number of persons to be chosen in each town or city.
2. The number of persons to be chosen in each county or city shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each town or city.
3. The number of persons to be chosen in each town or city shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each ward or district.
4. The number of persons to be chosen in each ward or district shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each precinct.
5. The number of persons to be chosen in each precinct shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each polling place.
6. The number of persons to be chosen in each polling place shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each street or lot.
7. The number of persons to be chosen in each street or lot shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each house or tenement.
8. The number of persons to be chosen in each house or tenement shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each family.
9. The number of persons to be chosen in each family shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each person.
10. The number of persons to be chosen in each person shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each individual.
11. The number of persons to be chosen in each individual shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each person.
12. The number of persons to be chosen in each person shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each individual.
13. The number of persons to be chosen in each individual shall be determined by the number of persons to be chosen in each person.
