AN ACT PLACING UNDER CIVIL SERVICE LAWS THE POSITION OF SECRETARY TO THE POLICE COMMISSIONER FOR THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7 of chapter 291 of the acts of
2 1906, as amended by chapter 377 of 1938, is hereby
3 further amended by striking out paragraph four of
4 said section 7 and inserting the following: —

5 Said police commissioner shall appoint a secretary,
6 who shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his
7 duties and shall keep such record, issue such notices
8 and attest such papers and orders as said police com-
9 missioner shall direct. He shall hold said office during
10 good behavior subject to removal in the manner pro-
11 vided by the civil service laws and rules.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall apply to the secretary
2 to the police commissioner for the city of Boston in
3 office upon its effective date.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
