AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MINIMUM DEPTH OF WINDOW SILLS ON ALL NEW BUILDINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 143 of the General Laws is hereby amended
- 2 by inserting after section 3K the following section: —
- 3 *Section 3L.* Windowsills on all new buildings
- 4 above the first story shall extend at least six inches
- 5 beyond the frame of the window and the exterior
- 6 surface of the wall of which it is a part, and these
- 7 windowsills will have no more than a five degree
- 8 slant in order to take care of drainage.
