RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY OF THE COMMISSION ESTABLISHED FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXAMINING THE STRUCTURE OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission estab-
2 lished by chapter seventy-five of the acts of nineteen
3 hundred and forty-nine, for the purpose of examining
4 the structure of the state government, shall, in making
5 its investigation and study, consider the subject matter
6 of current house document numbered two hundred
7 and sixty-one establishing a department of commerce
8 and defining its powers and duties; current house
9 document numbered two hundred and sixty-three
10 establishing a department of commerce and defining
11 its powers and duties; and current house document
12 numbered two hundred and sixty-four establishing a
13 division of commerce.
