## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

### AN ACT PLACING THE OFFICES OF ASSESSORS IN THE CITY OF MEDFORD UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Such of the offices of assessors in the  
2 city of Medford not already subject to the civil service  
3 laws and rules shall, upon the effective date of this  
4 act, become subject to said laws and rules, and the  
5 tenure of office of the incumbents thereof shall be  
6 unlimited, subject, however, to said laws. The in-  
7 cumbents of said offices on January first in the cur-  
8 rent year shall be deemed to be permanently appointed  
9 to their respective offices without serving any pro-  
10 bationary period.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its  
2 acceptance during the current year by vote of the  
3 city council of said city.
