AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE PLACING OF THE OFFICE OF BUILDING INSPECTOR OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The office of building inspector of the
2 city of Beverly shall, upon the effective date of this
3 act, become subject to the civil service laws and
4 rules, and the tenure of office of any incumbent
5 thereof shall be unlimited, subject, however, to said
6 laws. The incumbent of said office on said effective
7 date shall be subjected to a qualifying examination
8 for said office by the division of civil service. If said
9 incumbent passes said examination, he shall be certi-
10 fied for said office and shall be deemed to be perma-
11 nently appointed thereto without serving any pro-
12 bationary period, and his tenure of office shall be
13 unlimited, subject, however, to the provisions of said
14 laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the
2 voters of said city at the next city election in the form
3 of the following question, which shall be placed upon
4 the official ballot to be used at said election: — “Shall

5 an act passed by the General Court in the year nine-
6 teen hundred and fifty, entitled 'An Act to authorize
7 the placing of the office of building inspector of the
8 city of Beverly under the civil service laws', be ac-
9 cepted?" If a majority of the votes in answer to said
10 question is in the affirmative, this act shall take full
11 effect, but not otherwise.

6. It is not passed by the General Court in the year when
 it was passed and filed, entitled, "An Act to authorize
 7. the paying of the office of building inspector of the
 8. city of Boston under the civil service laws, in ac-
 9. cordance with the provisions of the act in answer to said
 10. question is in the affirmative, this act shall take effect
 11. from and after the date of its passage."
