MEMORANDUM OF COMMISSIONER OF CORPORATIONS AND TAXATION PURSUANT TO GENERAL LAWS, CHAPTER 3, SECTION 7, AS AMENDED, WITH RESPECT TO PETITION OF ANGELO V. BERLANDI FOR LEGISLATION TO REVIVE THE PRINCE CIVIC AND SOCIAL CLUB, INC.

*To the Honorable House Committee on Rules.*

The above-named petition was transmitted to me by the Clerk of the House Committee on Rules on April 13, 1950, with the request for a memorandum.

Pursuant to notification by me the petitioner filed an amendment of the petition to indicate why the object sought cannot be accomplished under the General Laws.

Prince Civic and Social Club, Inc., was organized under General Laws, chapter 180, July 25, 1949. The charter was declared void April 3, 1950, under the provisions of General Laws, chapter 180, section 27. In my opinion I have no authority to revive the corporation under General Laws, chapter 155, section 56, and the revival of the corporation can only be effected by the Legislature. No fee is required under General Laws, chapter 3, section 7.

The Legislature having declared its general policy to void the charter of a corporation under conditions set

forth under General Laws, chapter 180, section 27, it may be questioned whether restoration of the charter by special act would not tend to defeat that basic policy.

AN ACT REVIVING THE PRINCE CIVIC AND SOCIAL CLUB,

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The Prince Civic and Social Club, Inc., a corpora-  
2 tion dissolved April third, nineteen hundred and fifty,  
3 is hereby revived, with the same powers, duties and  
4 obligations as if said corporation had not been dis-  
5 solved.
