AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND ENABLE THE INHABITANTS OF WATERTOWN TO SELL A CERTAIN PORTION OF SALTONSTALL PARK AND OTHER PREMISES IN SAID WATERTOWN TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES AS AND FOR A FEDERAL POST OFFICE LOCATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The inhabitants of Watertown are
2 hereby authorized and enabled to sell a certain por-
3 tion of Saltonstall park so-called in said Watertown
4 and the premises upon which the Grant school is
5 now located to the government of the United States
6 as and for a location for a federal post office, the said
7 portion to be sold as aforesaid being shown on a plan
8 on file in the office of the town engineer of said town
9 entitled "Town of Watertown Plan Showing Portion
10 of Saltonstall Park," dated May twenty-fourth,
11 nineteen hundred and fifty, by Herbert C. Cook,
12 town engineer, bounded and described as follows:—
13 Southwesterly by Main street as shown on said
14 plan, one hundred and eleven and eighty-two one
15 hundredths feet;
16 Northwesterly by Whites avenue as relocated on
17 said plan, five hundred and twenty-three and ninety-
18 seven one hundredths feet more or less;

19 Northeasterly by land of Boston & Maine Rail-
20 road — Fitchburg Division — as shown on said plan,
21 one hundred and seventy-seven feet more or less;

22 Southeasterly by land of the town of Watertown
23 as shown on said plan, four hundred and seventy-nine
24 feet more or less;

25 Containing about seventy-eight thousand and eight
26 hundred square feet of land according to said plan.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon accept-
2 ance thereof by the town by a vote of a majority of
3 the members present at an annual or special town
4 meeting called for that purpose.
