The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE COMMONWEALTH SCHOOL OF NURSING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 17 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 6B, added by section 1 of chapter 713 of
3 the acts of 1966, the following section:—

4 *Section 6C.* The department of public health shall maintain
5 a nursing school to be known as the Commonwealth School of
6 Nursing in a suitable location in the city of Boston. Said
7 school shall be so maintained and operated in co-operation
8 with existing nursing schools as to comply with the standards
9 approved by nationally recognized nursing schools in the com-
10 monwealth. Said department shall make plans and may accept
11 grants or matching funds that are available or may become
12 available from the federal government or any other source,
13 public, or private, for constructing, financing, equipping, im-
14 proving or expanding said nursing school.

The Government of the Republic

Article 1. The Government of the Republic shall be vested in the President and the Senate.

Article 2. The President shall be elected for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election only once.

Article 3. The President shall have the honor and power of pardon, and shall be the commander in chief of the Army, Navy, and Air Force.

Article 4. The President shall have the power to grant pardons, and to commute, suspend, or remit punishments.

Article 5. The President shall have the power to declare war, and to make treaties, subject to the ratification of the Senate.

Article 6. The President shall have the power to appoint and remove officers of the Executive Department, and to grant commissions and discharges to the Army, Navy, and Air Force.

Article 7. The President shall have the power to grant and receive ambassadors, and to receive foreign ministers.

Article 8. The President shall have the power to grant and receive foreign honors, and to receive foreign ministers.
