AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF NO DEPOSIT - NO RETURN BOTTLES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 94 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 adding to said chapter the following new section: —

3 *Section 174B.* The use of no deposit - no return bottles in  
4 wholesale or retail sales is forbidden. The attorney-general  
5 shall have authority to bring suit in any of the equity courts  
6 of the commonwealth for the purpose of enjoining violations  
7 of this section.

Chapter 312 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding to said chapter the following new section:—

Section 174E. The case of the depositors of the Farmers and Laborers Bank of the State of New York is hereby referred to the Senate and House of Representatives for their consideration. The Senate and House of Representatives shall have authority to bring suit in any of the equity courts of the Commonwealth for the purpose of obtaining redress of the depositors of said bank.
