## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

### AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY TREASURER OF PLYMOUTH COUNTY TO PAY CERTAIN UNPAID BILLS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The county treasurer of Plymouth County is  
2 hereby authorized to pay from any available funds certain  
3 unpaid bills to the following: — Charles T. Cloutier, M.D., ten  
4 dollars and to Suffolk County, sixty-seven dollars and twenty  
5 cents, all for goods and services supplied or rendered to said  
6 county during the year nineteen hundred and sixty-eight and  
7 which are legally unenforceable against said county.

1 SECTION 2. No bill shall be approved by the county com-  
2 missioners of said county or paid by said treasurer under au-  
3 thority of this act unless and until certificates have been  
4 signed and filed with said treasurer stating under the penal-  
5 ties of perjury that the goods and services for which such  
6 bills have been submitted were ordered by an official or an  
7 employee of said county and that such goods were delivered  
8 and actually received by said county or that such services  
9 were rendered to said county, or both.

1 SECTION 3. Any person who knowingly files a certificate  
2 required by section two, which is false, and who thereby re-  
3 ceives payment for goods or services which were not received  
4 by or rendered to said county shall be punished by imprison-  
5 ment for not more than one year or by a fine of not more  
6 than three hundred dollars, or both.

The Government of the State

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety

AN ACT TO REPEAL THE COUNTY LAWS OF THE STATE  
 COUNTY TO BE REPEALED WITH

Section 1. The County of the State of New York is  
 authorized to pay from any available funds within  
 the county the following: — Charles T. County, N.Y., for  
 4 dollars and 50 cents, they shall be paid in 1889  
 5 cents for each, and every eighth or ninth pound  
 6 cents for each the year number shall be paid and  
 7 which are legally uncollectible against said county.

Section 2. No bill shall be approved by the county  
 1 misdeeds of said county or part of said territory, or  
 2 county of this act unless and until recorded and  
 3 signed and filed with said treasurer under the name  
 4 of the county, that the clerk and auditor for which year  
 5 this has been submitted were ordered by an official or  
 6 employee of said county and that goods were delivered  
 7 and actually received by said county or that same  
 8 were returned to said county or both.

Section 3. Any person who lawfully has a certificate  
 1 required by section two which is false and who there-  
 2 gives payment for goods or services which are not  
 3 by or returned to said county shall be punished by imprisonment  
 4 not more than one year or by a fine of not more  
 5 than three hundred dollars or both.
