AN ACT PROVIDING THAT TEACHERS IN THE INSTITUTIONS OF THE COMMONWEALTH BE GIVEN SALARY CREDIT FOR DEGREES HELD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 12 (d) Principals shall be placed in the second higher job group classification at his appropriate level.
