The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

**AN ACT ESTABLISHING A BOARD OF ARMORED CAR REGULATIONS
WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 22 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 14 the following sections:

3 *Section 15.* (a) There shall be in the department, but not
4 under the control of the Commissioner, a board to be known
5 as the Board of Armored Car Regulations which shall consist
6 of four members to be appointed by the governor for terms of
7 four year each and one member to be designated from time
8 to time by the Commissioner from among the members of the
9 uniformed branch of the state police. Of the members ap-
10 pointed by the governor one shall be a chief of police; one
11 shall be an officer of companies that are members in good
12 standing of the National Armored Car Association engaged in
13 the business of transporting coin, currency, bullion, notes,
14 stocks, bonds, drafts, securities, precious stones, precious
15 metals, jewelry, rare objects and other valuable documents
16 and items within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and
17 one shall be an officer of state or national charter bank or an
18 officer of the First District Federal Reserve Board. The other
19 member shall be determined by the governor. The governor
20 shall from time to time designate one member of the board
21 as chairman.

22 Each member shall serve without compensation but shall

23 receive from the Commonwealth all expenses necessarily in-
24 curred by him in connection with his official duties.

25 Such clerical, technical and other assistants as may be re-
26 quired by the board shall be assigned to it by the commis-
27 sioner.

28 The board shall promulgate rules and regulations relative
29 to the safety, inspection, equipment, maintenance and opera-
30 tion of armored cars used by those organizations in the busi-
31 ness of transporting coin, currency, bullion, notes, stocks,
32 bonds, drafts, securities, precious stones, precious metals,
33 jewelry, rare objects and other valuable documents or used
34 by organizations for their private use for such purposes.

35 The inspectors assigned to the division of inspection shall
36 enforce such rules and regulations.

1 SECTION 2. The four members first appointed by the gov-
2 ernor to the Board of Armored Car Regulations, established
3 under section fifteen of chapter twenty-two of the General
4 Laws, as inserted by section one of this act, shall serve for
5 terms of one, two, three or four years, respectively, as the
6 governor shall determine. Upon the expiration of the term of
7 each such member his successor shall be appointed for a term
8 of four years.
