In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PERSONNEL APPEALS BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 55 of chapter 30 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out in said section 55 the follow-
3 ing sentence: — “The director of personnel and standardiza-
4 tion shall furnish such clerical assistance as may be required
5 to carry out the provisions of sections fifty-three to fifty-
6 seven inclusive, and shall make provision for the keeping in
7 his office of the records relative to the disposition of grievances
8 of state employees.”

1 SECTION 2. Section 55 of chapter 30 of the General Laws,
2 as amended by section one of this act, is hereby further
3 amended by adding at the end of said section 55 the follow-
4 ing: — “Said board shall be independent of the Bureau of
5 Personnel and shall have its own quarters in the State House
6 or the State Office Building. Said board is authorized to em-
7 ploy such clerical assistance as may be required to carry out
8 the provisions of sections fifty-three to fifty-seven, inclusive.
9 Said board is authorized to expend such sums as may be ap-
10 propriated therefor.”

The Government of Pennsylvania

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Six

An Act relative to the Executive Office Building.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
 Court assembled, and by the authority of the Senate, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 55 of chapter 55 of the General Laws in
 2 hereby amended by striking out in said section the follow-
 3 ing sentence: — "The office of temporary and permanent
 4 stenographers shall be such as may be required
 5 to carry out the provisions of sections fifty-three to fifty-
 6 seven inclusive, and such other provision for the keeping in
 7 the office of the records relative to the disposition of business
 8 of said building."

1 Section 2. Section 56 of chapter 56 of the General Laws
 2 be amended by striking out of this act, in words further
 3 recited by adding at the end of said section the follow-
 4 ing: — "Said board shall be independent of the House of
 5 Representatives and shall have its own quarters in the State House
 6 or the State Office Building. Said board is authorized to ex-
 7 ploy such clerical assistants as may be required to carry out
 8 the provisions of sections fifty-three to fifty-seven inclusive.
 9 This board is authorized to expend such sums as may be ap-
 10 propriated therefor."
