AN ACT TO MAKE FURTHER PROVISION FOR THE STATE COUNCIL ON  
JUVENILE BEHAVIOR.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 159 of Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out the last two sentences and inserting  
3 in place thereof the following three sentences: — The mem-  
4 bers of the council shall be reimbursed for their expenses  
5 actually and necessarily incurred in the discharge of their  
6 duties. The council shall appoint an executive secretary who  
7 shall have had at least ten years of experience in juvenile  
8 delinquency work and who shall be exempt from the provisions  
9 of chapter 31. The executive secretary shall receive a salary  
10 of sixteen thousand dollars.
