AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF ASSISTANT TOWN CLERKS IN CERTAIN TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 19 of chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the last two sentences and inserting
3 in place thereof the following two sentences: — In towns of
4 under five thousand inhabitants no person appointed as assist-
5 ant clerk shall receive any salary for services as such from
6 the town, but his compensation, if any, for such services shall
7 be paid by the clerk, to whom all fees received by the assistant
8 shall be paid. In towns having five thousand or more in-
9 habitants an assistant clerk appointed under authority of this
10 section shall not be subject to chapter thirty-one.
