

By Mr. Speliotis of Danvers, petition of Theodore C. Speliotis relative to prohibiting the establishment or enforcement of production quotas for debit agents. Insurance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Three.

AN ACT PROHIBITING THE ESTABLISHMENT OR ENFORCEMENT OF PRODUCTION QUOTAS FOR DEBIT AGENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 187H the following section: —

3 *Section 187I.* No company which employs agents whose du-
4 ties include the collection of monthly or weekly premiums shall
5 establish or enforce any quota for the production of new business,
6 whether said quota shall be in terms of dollar amounts, relative
7 standing, percentage increase or any other basis or standard; nor
8 shall any such company terminate or threaten or attempt to termi-
9 nate the employment or license of any such agent for failure to
10 attain any such quota.

11 Upon complaint of any agent that his employment has been
12 threatened or terminated in violation of this section, the commis-
13 sioner shall hold a hearing. If the commissioner finds a violation of
14 this section, he may order such action as he may deem fitting or
15 appropriate and just, including but not limited to reinstatement of
16 the agent with full back pay, and injunction against the enforce-
17 ment and establishment of any quota.

The Government of the District of Columbia

Resolved, That the following be the rules of the House of Representatives for the District of Columbia:

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the District of Columbia.

Section 2. The members of the House of Representatives shall be chosen in the manner provided in the Constitution of the United States for Representatives from the States.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall assemble on the first Monday in January of every second year, and shall continue to meet until the adjournment thereof. The House of Representatives shall hold its sessions in the City of Washington, but may adjourn to any other place within the District of Columbia. The House of Representatives shall have the sole power of impeachment.

Section 4. The House of Representatives shall have the sole power of impeachment, and shall have the sole power to impeach and try any officer or employee of the Government of the District of Columbia who may be impeached.
