AN ACT TO REPEAL THE MINIMUM CONSUMER PRICE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

THE CONSTITUTION OF TEXAS

ARTICLE I. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

SECTION 1. The legislative power of this State shall be vested in the Legislature, which shall consist of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

SECTION 2. The Senate shall be composed of not more than one member from each county, to be elected by the qualified electors of the county for a term of two years, to begin on the first Monday in January next following their election, and to continue in office until their successors are chosen.

SECTION 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of not more than one member from each county, to be elected by the qualified electors of the county for a term of two years, to begin on the first Monday in January next following their election, and to continue in office until their successors are chosen.

SECTION 4. The Legislature shall assemble on the first Monday in January of each year, and shall continue in session until adjourned.
