AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL ASSISTANT CLERKS IN THE WORCESTER, BRISTOL AND SPRINGFIELD DIVISIONS OF THE JUVENILE COURT DEPARTMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 58 of Chapter 218 of the General Laws, as inserted by
- 2 Section 213 of Chapter 478 of the Acts of 1978, is hereby amended
- 3 by inserting at the end of the third paragraph thereof the
- 4 following:—
- 5 The Worcester division shall have a first assistant clerk and one
- 6 assistant clerk, who shall be appointed by the clerk subject to the
- 7 approval of the first justice. The Bristol and Springfield divisions
- 8 shall each have a first assistant clerk and three assistant clerks, who
- 9 shall be appointed by the clerk subject to the approval of the first
- 10 justice.

The Constitution of the United States

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: AS AMENDED BY THE THIRTEENTH, FOURTEENTH, FIFTEENTH, AND NINETEENTH AMENDMENTS.

1. We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.
