AN ACT TO FURTHER REGULATE THE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR AMBULANCE OPERATORS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 111(c) of the General Laws is hereby amended by ad-
2 ding after Section 6, a new section: —

3 *Section 6(a).* Municipally operated ambulance services as regu-
4 lated by both the department and the board shall be allowed to
5 transport patients in non-emergency situations with one operator
6 and one attendant trained as an emergency medical technician. In
7 such a non-emergency situation all emergency medical care re-
8 quirements previously approved in the case of an operator are
9 waived. The decision to have a second attendant transport the
10 patient shall be made by the director of the ambulance service and
11 the senior attendant on the scene of the injury.
