

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 3119

By Mr. Freeman of Chelmsford, petition of Bruce N. Freeman for legislation to increase the amount which may be charged by towns for the disposal of solid waste. Natural Resources and Agriculture.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Three.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE IN THE AMOUNT WHICH MAY BE CHARGED PER TON BY THE TOWN FOR EACH TON RECEIVED BY ANY SANITARY LANDFILL OWNED OR OPERATED BY ANY PERSON OTHER THAN A TOWN AGENCY OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The third paragraph of section 150A of chapter 111 of the
- 2 General Laws, as appearing in section 6 of chapter 1218 of the
- 3 acts of 1973, is hereby amended by striking out the first sen-
- 4 tence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —
- 5 If such facility is a landfill owned or operated by any per-
- 6 son other than a town or agency of the commonwealth, such
- 7 person shall pay to the town where the facility is located a
- 8 fee of fifty cents for each ton of solid waste from outside such
- 9 town which is disposed of in such landfill, excepting in a city,
- 10 which, by vote of its city council, or in a town, by vote of its
- 11 board of selectmen, increases such fee to such person up to or
- 12 including one dollar per ton.
