AN ACT FURTHER DEFINING THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE TAX ON RETAIL SALES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6 of Chapter 64H of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out subsection (u) and inserting in
3 place thereof the following new subsection:—

4 (u) Sale of a motor vehicle purchased by and for the use of a
5 person who has suffered loss, or permanent loss of use of both eyes,
6 both legs or both arms or one leg and one arm. This exemption
7 shall apply to one motor vehicle only owned and registered for the
8 personal, noncommercial use of such person.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
