- 1 *Whereas*, The current standard of living of many poor and
2 elderly Americans is such that they are compelled to live in sub-
3 standard housing and because of depressed finances are often
4 unable to pay to adequately heat their living quarters.
5 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives of Massachusetts
6 respectfully urges the Congress of the United States to enact legis-
7 lation to expand and better facilitate the Section 8 subsidy and
8 distribution formula to give direct rental assistance to house the
9 poor and elderly in the 2, 3 and 4-family homes of their communi-
10 ties through local housing and redevelopment authorities.
