**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Three.

AN ACT CONCERNING SECURITY PROTECTION AT ELDERLY HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Upon acceptance of the Act, the Governor of the  
2 Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall appoint a Senior Citizens  
3 Security Protection Council consisting of nineteen members; thir-  
4 teen members shall be selected from senior citizens one from each  
5 of the Commonwealth planning districts, one member represent-  
6 ing the Attorney General's office, one member representing the  
7 Department of Public Safety, three members who are employed in  
8 the planning, administration, education and delivery of law en-  
9 forcement activities, one member representing the Common-  
10 wealth's Council on Aging and one member representing the Mas-  
11 sachusetts Chapter of the National Association of Housing and  
12 Redevelopment Officials. The Governor shall appoint a chairper-  
13 son from the members on February first of each year.

1 SECTION 2. Members of the Senior Citizens Security Protec-  
2 tion Council shall serve for a term of three years and until a  
3 successor is appointed and be limited to no more than two consecu-  
4 tive terms in office after acceptance of the Act.

1 SECTION 3. The Senior Citizens Security Protection Council  
2 shall make studies, develop research materials, make suggestions  
3 and recommendations concerning ways and means of improving  
4 security of all types for the elderly developments in the Common-  
5 wealth.

THE GOVERNMENT OF ALABAMA

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF ALABAMA

SECTION 1. The Constitution of the State of Alabama is amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE I. Section 1. The Legislature shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

SECTION 2. The Senate shall be composed of twenty-five members, to be elected by the qualified electors of the State at the general election held in the year 1901, and in every fourth year thereafter. The House of Representatives shall be composed of thirty-five members, to be elected by the qualified electors of the State at the general election held in the year 1901, and in every second year thereafter. The members of the Senate shall hold office for six years, and the members of the House of Representatives shall hold office for two years. The Legislature shall assemble in regular session on the first Monday in January of each year.

SECTION 3. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeachment.

SECTION 4. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeachment.
