**AN ACT PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITH CERTAIN TINTED GLASS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting  
2 after section 13 the following section: —  
3 *Section 13A.* No person shall operate a vehicle which has glass  
4 windows or windshields which are more than twenty-five per cent  
5 tinted, or which vehicle has such windows or windshields that  
6 prevents seeing inside the vehicle from the outside. Any dealer of  
7 motor vehicles who sells a vehicle equipped with glass in violation  
8 of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not  
9 less than five hundred nor more than one thousand dollars or by  
10 imprisonment of not less than thirty nor more than sixty days in a  
11 house of correction.
