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RESOLVE REVIVING AND CONTINUING AND INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO REORGANIZATION OF THE HIGHWAY PROGRAMS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1     *Resolved*, That the special commission, established by section  
2 fourteen of chapter seven hundred and thirty-two of the acts of  
3 nineteen hundred and eighty-one, is hereby revived and continued.  
4 Said Commission shall, in the course of its investigation and study,  
5 consider the subject matter of 1983 Senate documents numbered  
6 1765 relative to requiring the Commonwealth to assume all costs of  
7 lighting and maintenance of certain bridges, 1772 relative to the  
8 transfer of Route 41 in West Stockbridge and Great Barrington,  
9 1774, directing the Department of Public Works to reconstruct  
10 South Street in the town of Belchertown and Poole Street in the  
11 town of Ludlow, 1775, directing the Department of Public Works  
12 to maintain Route 68 in the town of Hubbardston and 1983 House  
13 documents numbered 690, relative to reviving and continuing the  
14 special commission to reorganize the highway program of the  
15 Commonwealth, 1414, transferring the care of the bridge over the  
16 Deerfield River between the towns of Florida and Charlemont to  
17 the Department of Public Works, 2252, designating roads in Nan-  
18 tucket as state roads, 2847, directing the Department of Public  
19 Works to maintain Route 68 in the towns of Hubbardston,  
20 Rutland, and Holden, 2848, providing a means for the orderly  
21 reduction of the debt service obligations for the Highway Fund,  
22 and 5068, establishing a review commission relative to repair of  
23 streets, roads and bridges.

24     Said Commission shall report to the General Court the results of  
25 its investigation and study, and its recommendations if any,  
26 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommen-  
27 dations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of  
28 Representatives on or before the First Wednesday of December,  
29 nineteen hundred and eighty-three.
