The committee on Government Regulations, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 368) of Elizabeth N. Metayer and another for legislation to further regulate the game commonly called Beano, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3479) of Alfred A. Minahan, Jr., for legislation to require the State Lottery Commission to disclose odds for winning on tickets offered for sale by said commission, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4185) of Lawrence R. Alexander and other members of the House for legislation to require the State Lottery Commission to disclose odds of winning on tickets, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5508) of Thomas M. Finneran for legislation to establish a public safety lottery system, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6088) ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That the committee on Government Regulations be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject of current House documents numbered: — 368, legislation further regulating the game commonly called Beano; 3479, legislation requiring the State Lottery Commission to disclose odds of winning on tickets; 4185, legislation requiring the State Lottery Commission to disclose odds of winning on tickets; and 5508, legislation providing for a public safety lottery system.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within the Commonwealth, and may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of such legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the clerk of the House on or before the first Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and eighty-three.
