AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF TEWKSBURY AND THE CITY OF LOWELL TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE AND SALE OF WATER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Tewksbury is hereby authorized to
2 purchase water from the city of Lowell, and the city of Lowell is
3 hereby authorized to sell water to said town upon such terms and
4 conditions as may be agreed upon by the board of public works in
5 said town the water department of said city. Said board of public
6 works and said water department may, by written contract, agree
7 upon the quantity of water to be supplied, the method of measure-
8 ment of the same, and the price to be paid therefor, and all matter
9 incidental thereto; and such contracts when duly executed by au-
10 thority of said board of public works and said water department
11 shall be binding upon said town and said city for such time as said
12 board of public works and said water department may agree upon.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
