The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE PERSONNEL DIRECTOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH TO REVIEW A CERTAIN APPOINTMENT, TO THE OFFICE OF SPECIAL INVESTIGATOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 31 of the General
2 Laws, or any other general or special law to the contrary, the
3 Personnel Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to
4 review and, if necessary, redress the process by which Mr. Joseph
5 Gibney, a disabled veteran of the Vietnam era, was not appointed
6 to the position of Special Investigator I within the Bureau of
7 Special Investigations. The Personnel Administrator is instructed
8 to consider all aspects of the testing and selection procedure,
9 which initiated with an exam on January 29, 1992, and concluded
10 with the appointment of said Investigators on December 12, 1993.
11 Said Personnel Administrator is further authorized and directed to
12 take whatever steps he deems necessary to correct any legitimate
13 grievance.
