The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Five.

AN ACT PERMITTING ALIENS TO ACT AS MANAGERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 138 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 26 as appearing in the 1990 Official Edition, and
3 inserting in place thereof the following section: —

4 Section 26. No corporation, organized under the laws of the
5 commonwealth or of any other state or foreign country, shall be
6 given a license under section twelve, thirteen, fifteen, eighteen, or
7 nineteen, or a transportation permit under section twenty-two
8 unless such corporation shall have first appointed, in such manner
9 as the licensing authorities by regulation prescribe, as manager or
10 other principal representative, a resident of the commonwealth,
11 and shall have vested in him by properly authorized and executed
12 written delegation as full authority and control of the premises,
13 described in the license of such corporation, and of the conduct of
14 all business therein relative to alcoholic beverages as the licensee
15 itself could in any way have and exercise if it were a natural per-
16 son resident in the commonwealth, nor unless such manager or
17 representative is, with respect to his character, satisfactory to the
18 licensing authorities.
