

By Mr. Mariano of Quincy, petition of Ronald Mariano relative to the motorcycle safety fund and establishment of rider training programs. Public Safety.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MOTORCYCLE SAFETY FUND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 15 of Chapter 22 of the General Laws, as so appearing,
2 is hereby amended by striking out all in Paragraph 2 and inserting
3 in place thereof the following paragraph: —

4 The bureau, in consultation with the secretary of the executive
5 office of public safety, shall appoint a training committee whose
6 duties shall be to administer and oversee training courses, estab-
7 lish programs and funding guidelines, approve applications for
8 grants to establish motorcycle rider training programs and super-
9 vising instructors. Said committee shall consist of five members
10 including two Site Administrators or their designee, an Instructor
11 Representative who is an instructor at a motorcycle rider training
12 program, a Motorcycle Dealer and a Representative of the Massa-
13 chusetts Motorcycling Community who is the Chairperson of the
14 Modified Motorcycle Association of Massachusetts, Inc. or his
15 designee. The minimum requirements for said Site Administrators
16 serving on said committee shall be the following: a) the adminis-
17 tration shall have a minimum of three years experience as
18 provider of a program under contract with the bureau; b) both
19 administrator positions must be filled by administrators who serve
20 at two different motorcycle rider training programs under contract
21 with the bureau. The minimum requirements for said Instructor
22 Representative serving on said committee shall be the following:
23 a) The instructor representative shall be an instructor certified by
24 the Motorcycle Safety Foundation with a minimum of five years

25 experience; b) the instructor representative shall have taught at a
26 program under contract with the bureau for a minimum of three
27 years; c) the instructor representative shall not be certified as a
28 Chief Instructor and d) the instructor representative shall meet the
29 minimum requirements established in Paragraph 3 of Section 15
30 of Chapter 22 of the General Laws. Members of said committee
31 shall meet bi-weekly at a site provided by the bureau. Members of
32 said committee shall serve without compensation for their services
33 in said capacity. The bureau shall appoint an administrative assis-
34 tant whose duties shall be to serve subordinate to said committee.
35 Said administrative assistant shall be a full-time employee of the
36 bureau who may not serve in any other function of the bureau.
