**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**AN ACT TO FURTHER DEFINE THE MASSACHUSETTS WATER RESOURCES AUTHORITY.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Paragraph (b) of section 3 of chapter 372 of the Acts of 1984 is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the second sentence and inserting  
3 in place thereof the following sentence:—  
4 One member of the board of directors shall be the secretary of  
5 the executive office of environmental affairs, serving ex officio,  
6 one member of the board of directors who is a resident of the  
7 Connecticut river basin community who represents water  
8 resources protection interests shall be appointed by the governor  
9 and shall serve coterminous with the governor, one member of the  
10 board of directors who is a resident of a Merrimack river basin  
11 community who represents water resources protection interests  
12 shall be appointed by the governor and shall serve coterminous  
13 with the governor, one member of the board of directors shall be  
14 appointed by the governor upon the recommendation of the mayor  
15 of Quincy in accordance with the procedure set forth in para-  
16 graph (c) and shall serve a term of four years, one member of the  
17 board of directors shall be appointed by the governor upon the  
18 recommendation of the board of selectmen of the town of  
19 Winthrop by majority vote, in accordance with the procedure set  
20 forth in paragraph (c) shall serve a term of four years; provided  
21 however, that one of the previous named five members shall be a  
22 minority person; three members of the board of directors shall be  
23 appointed by the mayor of the city of Boston and shall serve  
24 coterminous with the mayor, provided however, that one of the

25 three members shall be a minority person; and three members of  
26 the board of directors shall be appointed by the advisory board as  
27 provided in section twenty-three of this act.
