AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 32E of chapter 94C of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in the 1990 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the
3 following paragraph: —

4 In determining weight under this section, the weight shall be
5 the cumulative weight of the particular class of the controlled sub-
6 stance knowingly and intentionally manufactured, distributed, dis-
7 pensed or cultivated or possessed with intent to manufacture,
8 distribute, dispense or cultivate in any twelve month period.
