AN ACT PROHIBITING PERSONS CHARGED OR CONVICTED OF SEXUAL ABUSE FROM RECEIVING PROBATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 87 of Chapter 276 of the General Laws, as appearing in
2 the Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out said sec-
3 tion and inserting in its place the following new section:—
4 Section 87. The superior court, any district court and any juve-
5 nile court may place on probation in the care of its probation
6 officer any person before it charged with an offense or a crime
7 except for any person charged with or convicted of an offense or
8 crime under Sections thirteen B, twenty-two A, twenty-three or
9 twenty-four B of Chapter 265, or section thirty-five A of Chap-
10 ter 272, for such time and upon such conditions as it deems
11 proper, with the defendant's consent, before trial and before a plea
12 of guilty, or in any case after a finding or verdict of guilty; pro-
13 vided, that, in the case of any child under the age of seventeen
14 placed upon probation by the superior court, he may be placed in
15 the care of a probation officer of any district court or of any juve-
16 nile court, within the judicial district of which said child resides.
