AN ACT RELATIVE TO EXTENDING THE TIME FOR CANDIDATES FOR STATE OFFICE TO FILE NOMINATION PAPERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 10 of chapter 53 of
2 the General Laws, as appearing in the 1992 Official Edition, is
3 hereby amended by striking the first sentence and inserting in
4 place thereof the following: —

5 All certificates of nomination and nomination papers of candi-
6 dates for the office of state representative, state senator, executive
7 council, or county office shall be filed with the state secretary on
8 or before the last Tuesday of June in the year in which a state
9 election is to be held.

1 SECTION 2. The third paragraph of section 48 of chapter 53
2 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1992 Official Edition, is
3 hereby further amended by striking the first sentence and inserting
4 in place thereof the following: —

5 All candidates of nomination and nomination papers of candi-
6 dates for the office of state representative, state senator, executive
7 council, or county office shall be filed with the state secretary on
8 or before the last Tuesday of June in the year in which a state
9 election is to be held.
