AN ACT TO REFORM THE REPORTING OF FELONIES COMMITTED IN
CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Representatives and original Members of the Senate shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in the most numerous State.

No Person shall be Representative of this State unless he shall have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of this State.
