**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF CERTAIN FORMER INVESTIGATORS EMPLOYED BY THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES CONTROL COMMISSION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 90A of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as amended by  
2 section 41 of chapter 412 of the acts of 1991, is hereby further  
3 amended by adding the following paragraph: —

4 Any investigator of the alcoholic beverages control commission  
5 who has been retired under any provision of this chapter or similar  
6 provision of earlier law on account of injuries sustained or of  
7 hazard undergone in the performance of his duty shall have his  
8 retirement allowance increased to an amount not exceeding one  
9 half the rate of regular compensation payable to investigators of  
10 the alcoholic beverages control commission holding similar posi-  
11 tions, at the time of increasing such allowance in the comparable  
12 grade or classification, as determined by the personnel adminis-  
13 trator occupied by such former investigator at the time of his  
14 retirement.
