AN ACT REDUCING THE TAX ON UNEARNED INCOME.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4 of Chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in

3 out paragraph (a), and inserting in place thereof the following

5 (a) Part A taxable income shall be taxed at the rate of five
