The committee on Insurance, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 806) of Richard R. Tisei for legislation relative to the purchase of travel reservation insurance, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2201) of Ronald Mariano for legislation to require notice to employees prior to cancellation of health insurance benefits, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2591) of Paul E. Caron for legislation to continue group health insurance coverage for certain employees whose employment has terminated, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2592) of Paul E. Caron relative to premium finance agencies, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3365) of Ronald Mariano relative to accident and health insurance under group or master policies of credit life, accident and health, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3370) of William G. Reinstein relative to the rates for joint credit accident and health insurance policies, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3936) of James T. Brett for legislation to provide for human services provider liability insurance, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4907) ought to be adopted.

1 *Ordered,* That the committee on Insurance be authorized to sit
2 during the recess of the General Court to make an investigation
3 and study of Senate Document numbered 806, and on House
4 Documents numbered 2201, 2591, 2592, 3365, 3370, 3936,
5 relative to property and casualty and life insurance.

6 Said committee shall report to the General Court the result of
7 its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recom-
9 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the
10 House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday in
11 December, nineteen hundred and ninety-five.
