### AN ACT RELATIVE TO PAYMENTS TO SURVIVING SPOUSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is amended by deleting: In  
2 Section 9(2)(a) the words “and does not remarry” in line 50, and in  
3 Section 100 by striking the sentence beginning on Line 24, and the  
4 words “or remarriage” on Lines 26 and 33. Further, the words “for  
5 as long as she remains unremarried” on Line 10 of Section 101 shall  
6 be struck.
