Goguen and another for legislation to further regulate liquor license fees issued by municipal boards, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2924) of Richard Mallett for legislation to raise to twenty-one the age of persons authorized to sell or serve alcoholic beverages, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3540) of Mary Jeanette Murray for legislation to prohibit the advertising of alcoholic beverages on television and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4119), of Sally P. Kerans and other members of the General Court for legislation to require the posting of signs warning of the hazardous effects of the consumption of alcoholic beverages during pregnancy, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5061) ought to be adopted.

4 457; and House documents numbered 41, 43, 541, 542, 900, 1499,
5 1501, 1684, 1685, 1826, 1828, 2554, 2924, 3540 and 4119, each
6 relative to alcoholic beverages.

7 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its
8 investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together
9 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations
10 into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Repre-
11 sentatives on or before the first Wednesday in December, nineteen
12 hundred and ninety-five.
